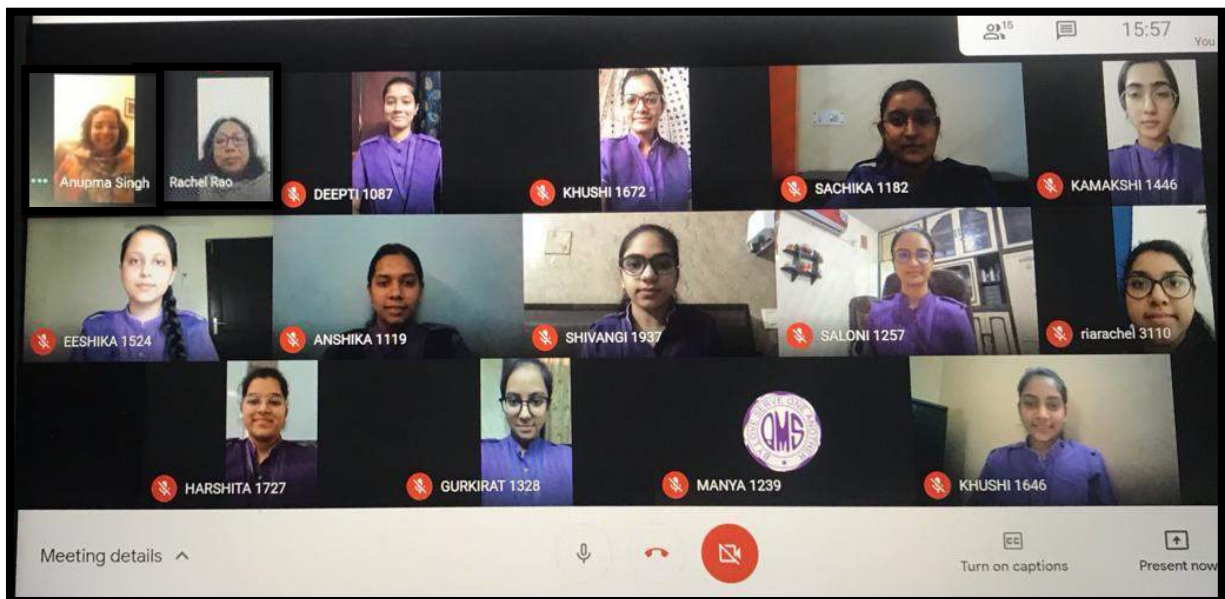

### Award Ceremony

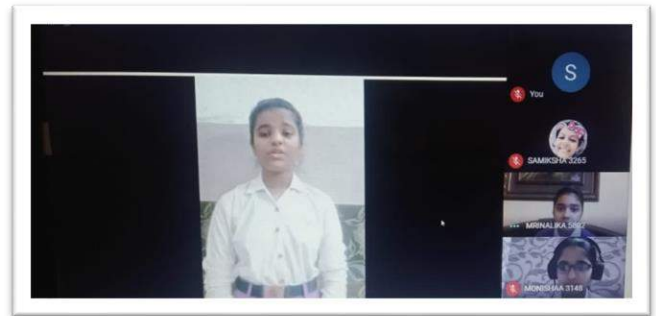
Students were awarded with the E-certificates of appreciation for showing their outstanding performance in Scholastic & Co-Scholastic areas for the session 2019-2020.

# Children's Day Celebrations

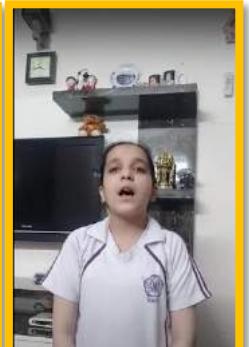
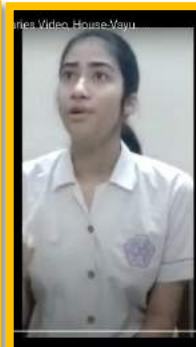

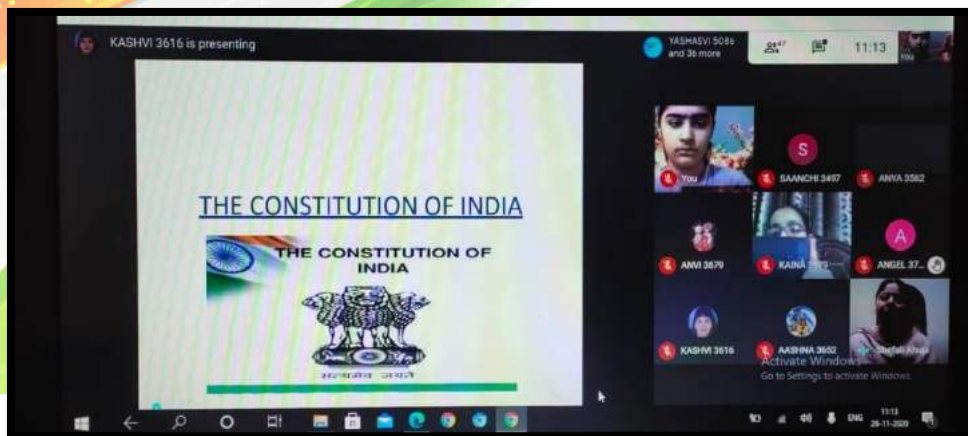
Various interesting Diwali activities were organized for our students to celebrate Diwali:

### INTERACT CLUB

Interact clubs bring together young people ages 12-18 to develop leadership skills while discovering the power of Service above Self, the motto of Rotary.

From our school there are 40 Interactors participating actively in the various projects of the Interact Club from Classes IX to XII.

Interact is a club to connect with others in their community or school. Interact club members have fun while carrying out service projects and learning about the world. Interact clubs organize at least two service projects a year: one that benefits their community and one that encourages international understanding. While Interact clubs receive guidance from individual Rotary clubs, they govern and support themselves.

Staying true to tradition and founding goals, interact has a hierarchy of leadership composed of chosen interactors, responsible for the governance of the club. The District Interact Representative (DIR) is responsible for the interact clubs of a district in a city, they are aided by Zonal Interact Representatives (ZIR) who are given the responsibility of a specific zone inside the district.
