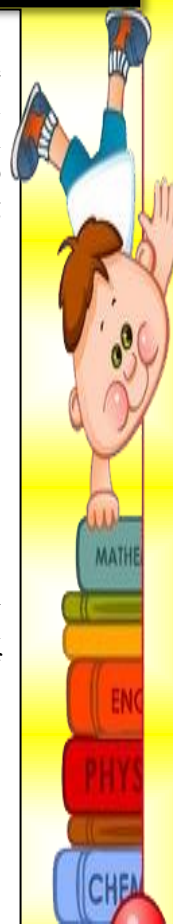
12\9\17: Art competition for classes I to V was organised in school by Faber Castell.
